## Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH)

### **Overview of the Initial Endorsement**

The VAIMH Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Endorsement® is for providers who live in Virginia and work with infants/toddlers (birth to 36 months) and/or young children (age 3 up to age 6).
